 - (d) What was Chinua Achebe's plea to the African critics?
 - (e) How does Chinua Achebe react to the hostile reception of his first novel?

- (h) Attempt a brief character sketch of Petrus.

- 3. Answer the following questions: $14 \times 4 = 56$
 - "Said argues that representations of the 'orient' in European literary texts, travelogues and other writings contributed to the creation of a dichotomy between Europe and its 'others', a dichotomy that was central to the creation of European culture as well as to the maintenance and extension of European hegemony over other lands."

Explain the concept of 'orientalism' as propounded by Edward Said.

Or

Write a note on the major issues and concepts of post-colonial literature.

(b) Make an assessment of Chinua Achebe's essay Colonialist Criticism as an example of post-colonial critique of colonialist discourse.

Or

Attempt an assessment of Chinua Achebe's post-colonial reading of the European notion of literary criticism with proper illustrations from the essay, Colonialist Criticism.

(c) How does Amitav Ghosh's The Shadow. Lines offer a critique of the idea of nationalism and national boundaries?

Or

Discuss the issues of 'belonging' and 'migration' as reflected in *The Shadow Lines*.

Or

Present an assessment of the character of Tridib.

(d) Critically assess the post-apartheid situation in South Africa from your reading of the novel, *Disgrace*.

Or

Write a critical note on different symbols used by Coetzee in Disgrace.

Or

Present an assessment of the character of Lucy.
